Our goal is to stop looking at ourselves and to learn to look at others in order to feel good about ourselves. In our team, the group is more important than the individual; this is our core principle. And to give our all, in order to help others.

Our association is founded on respect. Our Code of Ethics is as follows:

. Respect for the club and its values

A.E Ramassà believes that its image and reputation are one of its main qualities for preserving the trust of its partners, followers and sponsors. Thus, the club's players and members of must play close attention to preserving its image and reputation during each and every one of its public activities.

As representatives of the team, the players and members of A.E. Ramassà also need to be equally careful during any public appearance and should inform their managers ahead of any activity with the media, on social networks or any other activity that suggests that it may circulate among the public and that they may react to it.

. Respect for the public

The public, which encourages the team that encourages, is one of the main protagonists in this sport. In grassroots football, the public is made up of family members, friends, members of the club, or people from the local neighbourhood, amongst others. Peoples who like grassroots football and also people who love the club and want it to grow.



Football players must respect the public and the manner in which it shows its support for another club, even when it is expressing its unhappiness. Above all, the public goes to see a performance; it is for this reason that A.E. Ramassà's players, when entering or leaving the pitch, will greet and applaud the opponent for the simple reason that the public has come to see the match.

In the same way that the club expects respect for the opposite team, its players also have to behave in an exemplary manner.

.Respect for the referee

The referee is the judge of the match, who decides the validity of actions. Aside from being by himself, he is placed under a high level of pressure (as in in any type of work), which increases when he is under the eye of a large number of persons, to intervene in your decisions, in either in an active or passive way. It must be remembered that the referee is human and just as we make mistakes, he too can make them. It is for this reason that when addressing him, he will be treated with courtesy and his decisions will be respected, even if we know that they were not the correct ones.

. Respect for opponents

Opponents are our friends on the pitch. They must be respected by playing clean, avoiding harming them, and when this does not happen (accidentally), they should be apologised to. When playing a home match, the opponent should be treated not as an opponent, but as a guest. It is essential to try and be polite to the opponent before the match begins, giving them the means and space to do their work. At the beginning and the end of the match, they will be greeted in the same way that we would greet a guest in our own home

. Respect for the coach and the technical team

The coach is the leader of the team, who spends his time on improving the performance of the group, drawing up training activities and strategies in order to achieve this. If you do not pay attention during training, instructions will not be understood by everybody and it will be time wasted. During matches, it is he who has the authority to select the line-up and make any changes, and this must be respected by every member of the group.

.Respect for moral, educational and professional commitment

Football is a sport which advocates well-defined values, such as companionship, healthy living, hygiene, respect, etc. Thus, the players have to develop and promote these values with the rest of the group.



. Developing individual and collective performance

Every football player must seek to contribute to personal and collective improvement through developing their own performance. It will be necessary to attend training and matches and to give one's all in each. Likewise, they have to be aware that there is a form of play that they have to adapt themselves to.

. Respect for the group

Every member of the group must receive the same respect as one wishes for oneself. Thus, insults, fighting, or discrimination of any kind will not be tolerated, as when they are on the pitch, they have to accept any individual decisions and mistakes that their teammates make. If a group is not respected off the pitch, there cannot be any respect on it.

. Pride in belonging to the club

The club will observe and defend the interests of its players, treat them in the best way possible so that they feel proud to belong to A.E. Ramassà, a club of solidarity and commitment, the club of values.
